

A BYLAW TO REGULATE TRAFFIC IN THE MUNICIPALITY

The Council of The Rural Municipality of Good Lake No. 274, in the Province of Saskatchewan: enacts as follows:

1. In this bylaw,
 - (a) "vehicle" means a devise in, on or by which a person or thing is or may be transported or drawn on a highway, and includes:
 - (i) A "vehicle" as defined under the Highway Traffic Act;
 - (ii) an "all terrain vehicle" as defined under the All Terrain Vehicles Act;
 - (iii) an "agricultural implement" as defined under the Highway Traffic Act, or any other agricultural equipment;
 - (iv) a trailer;
 - (v) a bicycle;
 - (b) "lake" refers to the body of water known commonly as either Good Spirit Lake or Devil's Lake located in Township 29 and 30 in Ranges 5 and 6, West of the Second Meridian, Saskatchewan.
2. No person shall operate a vehicle, or allow or cause a vehicle to be operated in the lake or within 200 metres from the shore of the lake unless a permit to do so has been issued by the municipality.
3. Any person or corporation in contravention of Section 2 is guilty of an offense punishable by summary conviction, and shall be liable
 - (a) to a fine of not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$2,000.00,
 - (b) to incarceration in default of payment of the said fine.
4. The municipal administrator may, upon the application of a person or corporation, and upon payment of the prescribed fee, if any, issue a permit for;
 - (a) the use of any vehicle for a specified purpose within 200 metres of the lake shore, or
 - (b) the use by vehicles of any particular place or facility within 200 metres of the lake shore.
5. (a) Any person or corporation aggrieved by the decision to grant or refuse a permit may apply to the council of the municipality for a review of the decision of the administrator
 - (b) The council may, after hearing submissions on the application, uphold or reverse the decision of the administrator upon any grounds that council sees fit, and the decision of the council shall be final.

AMENDMENT

- 6) All provisions of this Bylaw shall not apply to any Municipal road allowance applicable in this Bylaw.
